Richard Tafoya: NORA's Line Superintendent



Known for their hard work, selfless efforts, and dedication to safety, the heart and soul of any electric cooperative lies within its line crew.

The job of a lineman carries extreme risk. Their ultimate goal is to keep the power on regardless of the weather conditions. This requires the maintenance and repair of overhead distribution and transmission lines, installing and maintaining transformers and other equipment, trimming trees growing near transmission lines, and determining what action to take when calls come in for outages and other situations. One of their most difficult duties is responding to outages at night and in inclement weather.

The man in charge of all of this at NORA Electric Cooperative is Line Superintendent Richard Tafoya. Born and raised in Socorro, New Mexico, Richard is a graduate of Socorro High School. He began his career at Socorro Electric, a fellow NMREC cooperative, where he worked for twenty years before being hired by NORA in July 2018.

Richard started at NORA as a working foreman, and then in 2021, when longtime Director of Operations John Blea retired, he was promoted to that role becoming the direct supervisor of the line crew, overseeing operations, maintenance and construction. In addition to that, Richard is also responsible for staffing, purchasing materials for the warehouse, and safety coordinator.

One of the tasks he enjoys the most in his job is troubleshooting calls and outages and the ability to assist the crew in restoring power to the affected service area. However, the demands of the job such as working long hours on nights, weekends, on holidays and during family occasions can be the most challenging and difficult.

In his free time, Richard enjoys spending quality time with his wife of 27 years, Deana, and their three adult children. He also likes fishing in the local streams and lakes including the Chama and Brazos Rivers and Hopewell Lake. He is also active with the Chama Volunteer Fire Department, and he is a 4-H leader as well.

Steps to Take This Summer to Save Energy

Seal and Insulate. You want to keep hot air out and cool air in during summer and vice versa in winter, so take some time to inspect your home for air leaks and poor attic insulation. For the most thorough assessment, consider scheduling a professional energy audit in which technicians use infrared heat mapping to pinpoint your home's thermal weak spots.

Consider a Window Upgrade. Window replacement can be costly, but you will see a return on your investment over time in energy efficiency and comfort. For single-pane or aged and drafty windows, energy savings could really be significant. Make a financial plan for this investment if you're not ready to upgrade now.

Smart Thermostats. The latest thermostats can be controlled from anywhere with a smartphone, making it easy to control the temperature when you're away from home. Many smart thermostats can even learn your heating and cooling habits and anticipate your home comfort needs to save you money.

Get a Furnace Tune Up. Schedule this once a year, ideally in late summer or early fall. An HVAC technician will clean the system, perform preventative maintenance, and take other steps to optimize energy efficiency and prevent breakdowns. If you have an air conditioner, have the system winterized in preparation for colder months ahead.
