supervising the accounting department as Controller, a role she has maintained since she was hired in September 2017.

Some of the expectations and duties that she performs on a regular basis are the reconciliation of the general ledger accounts, oversight of daily transactions on the consumer services side, payroll, and the administration of benefits for employees.

Marla plays an integral role in NORA's budgeting process, preparing the cooperative's statement of operations and balance sheet. She makes sure loan and interest payments and investments are kept current and balanced, and she

Every month, Marla prepares the financial statements for the Board of Trustees. She also prepares all documents necessary for tax reporting at the local, state, and federal levels. This enables the Board and executive management to adequately interpret and analyze all of the financial information and reports associated with the cooperative. This information is crucial for maximizing the efficiency of the company.

She graduated from Valley High School in Albuquerque and she attended the University of New Mexico and earned her accounting degree through Northern New Mexico Community College.

- NORA will develop and implement a plan to install EV stations.
 - Two EV stations installed in Chama at the railroad station and two installed in Tierra Amarilla at Henry's.
- NORA will review and update the administrative policies. ٠
- NORA will conduct a comprehensive system maintenance review to decrease outages & line loss. ٠
 - This is an everyday process of evaluating distribution lines and tree trimming.
- NORA will develop and implement a marketing plan to promote the cooperative to new & existing members and ٠ communities served.
- NORA will review and replace aging infrastructure and facilities to improve operational efficiency and reduce costs. ٠ Maintenance tasks are performed daily.
- NORA will look at distributing capital credits to member owners consistent with sound financial management. ٠ Completed: \$201,084.18 for 1988 and 1990 was distributed in August 2024.
- NORA will continue with a new metering system. ٠
 - Approximately 500 meters have been changed to date. Members will benefit from the meter data management system (MDM) which allows a global system map to show real time outages online.



NORA will review and continue updates to cyber security. NORA will review reliable transmission service options.
